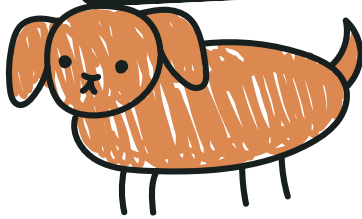


Staying safe around dogs when out and about

Use the boxes below to write or draw about the correct way to greet a dog safely. Objective: Describe the correct way to greet a dog safely.

Check

Ask the owner's permission.

Call

Allow the dog to come to you.

Give the dog three gentle strokes on the shoulder (if the dog seems comfortable and relaxed).

1. When dogs are tied up, wherever that may be; stop, give them space, and do not approach them!

2. Dogs who are away from their owner may feel worried so giving them space is important!

Objective: Recognise the importance of not approaching dogs when they are tied up.

We should always ask the owner's permission, so if they are not there and we can't, don't stroke the dog!
